

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,773.23 and the number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 697². Polling Stations will be open from 7am till 10pm and normal election rules will be observed.

Voters may vote by post or proxy as well as at a polling station.

Vote by post

Applications to vote by post can be requested by emailing electionservices@melton.gov.uk or calling 01664 502502 or download and print a form from our website at http://www.melton.gov.uk/downloads/file/4604/postal_vote_application_form.

Completed applications must reach us **before 5pm on Tuesday 20 April 2021**. Applications require your date of birth and signature (not an electronic signature). You have the option to choose how long you want your postal vote for. Postal votes can be cancelled up to 11 days before the poll if you decide you want to vote at a polling station.

Voting by proxy

If you are not able to cast your vote in person, you can ask someone you trust to vote for you. The person casting your vote is referred as your proxy.

To apply for a proxy vote, you have to complete a form and give a reason why you cannot get to your polling station in person. Completed applications must reach us **before 5pm on Tuesday 27 April 2021**. Applications can be requested by emailing electionservices@melton.gov.uk or calling 01664 502502 or download and print a form from our website at http://www.melton.gov.uk/downloads/file/4863/proxy_vote_application_form. Your proxy must be a registered elector.

² The limit to expenses is £2,362 plus 59p per elector. Please note that the electorate may change when the deadline for the registration update is published.

The finished Plan must be accepted by a majority vote for the area before it can be adopted, if more than 50% of electors voting in the referendum support the Neighbourhood Plan it will be adopted.
